MDE Restorative Practices Trainings

Restorative practices are drawn from the traditions of Indigenous People and Communities of Color around the world. Restorative practices are an approach schools can use to build relationships, improve school climate, and repair harm. All sessions and trainings will be facilitated by restorative practices practitioner/trainers. Continuing Education Units (SEU's) and Administrative CEU's will be offered. People who work in education, restorative justice/practices and with youth are welcome to register. Space is limited and will be granted on a first-come, first-served basis.

- [Restorative Practices Affinity Circles for Connection and Support](#) will be held June 16-17 online and June 23-24 in person.
